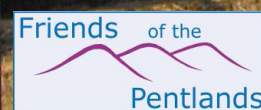

Conserving, Protecting and Enhancing

We do this through a wide range of activities:

- carrying out projects to improve public access and biodiversity
- working with other local organisations and corporate groups
- commenting on planning applications
- arranging a programme of walks and talks for members
- publications and exhibitions



Practical projects have included:

- ▲ creating 5 arboreta of Scottish native trees, with accompanying information leaflets
- improvements to the footpath at "the Thieves Road"
- PW setting up the Pentland Way, a 22-mile signed footpath across the Pentlands complete with a guidebook and wayside information panels
- M providing mobility scooters and guides to enable people to explore paths around Harlaw and Threipmuir reservoirs
- ▲ planting 20 fruit trees at Harlaw
